

OVERALL DESIGN INTENT

The Franklin foreshore area has been a focal point for rowing, cricket, football, cycling and other sports since the 1800s and is strongly linked with the early history of Franklin's settlement and the development of the Huon Valley.

- Promote the use of the Franklin foreshore area and support measures to increase community access to the foreshore creating a sporting precinct that can be enjoyed by the community.
- Improve pedestrian access from the existing walking track to the Franklin oval.
- Promote the area for event use including improvement of landscape amenity and facilities along the foreshore.
- Retain areas of established vegetation and ensure placement of new landscaping is consistent with existing use of the area and utilise indigenous species to the benefit of the long term health of the Franklin foreshore area.

1. Improve the visual amenity of the area by painting elements of the Tennis club rooms facing the walking track.
2. Improve vehicle control by defining existing car parking areas around the Bowls and Tennis Club and restrict public vehicle access to the foreshore.
3. Existing Franklin cenotaph to be relocated to a more suitable location in the future.
4. Construct 2 practice cricket nets 30m long 8m wide to improve sporting amenities and support the increased use of the area for events.
5. Install picnic tables, reinstate grass surface and plant shade trees to promote recreational use of the area.
6. Formalise walking track with defined edges to improve pedestrian access along the foreshore. Install appropriate landscaping either side.
7. Install removable bollards to restrict vehicular access to the walking track but allowing for service vehicles to maintain the area.
8. Interpretive signage to highlight the history of Franklin's cycling velodrome, football and cricket achievements. Liaise with the local clubs to gather information, images and stories that demonstrate the history of the area.
9. Install statue or interpretive sign celebrating the prolific rowing success that Franklin has fostered. Liaise with local rowing clubs and historians to develop interpretive signage panels to demonstrate the sporting history of the area.
10. Raised garden beds with built in seating provide formal landscaping surrounded by picnic tables and chairs.
11. Shared half court basketball and half court tennis court with concrete tennis rebound wall to increase the available space at the public tennis court.
12. Existing sporting clubrooms to be refurbished in the future.
13. Future lighting to be installed around the oval to allow for increased use during times of low light.
